# These are the Pou (Pillars) by which we are governed

#### 1: Community engagement and participation

- Creating diverse community groups as a resource to support the continuation of the trust's vision.
- Undertaking consultation with local business and education providers to support outcomes relevant to our local communities.
- Facilitating both employee and volunteer involvement.
- Liaise with local body and government agencies to show case the vision and focus areas of the trust.

#### 2. Provision of recommended riparian planting

- Support riparian planting as an effective means of reducing erosion and minimising the incidence of flooding.
- Increasing and protecting green corridor habitats to the sea for all native flora and fauna.
- Establishing a nursery of 'recommended plants', working in conjunction with local nurseries.
- Utilise the nursery for the purpose of showcasing the work of the trust.
- 3. Supporting sustainable land use practices
- Encourage landowners to appreciate the gains of increased pasture productivity as a result of riparian protection.
- Highlighting the importance of increasing soil fertility as a mechanism for protection against erosion.
- Support and promote the incorporation of lwi Kaitiakitanga and Tauiwi conservation principles in local agricultural practices
- Improving water quality through natural water filtration methods.

#### 4. Sustaining what we set out to achieve

- Promotion and marketing of the trust as a mechanism for gaining local support, increasing and sustaining trust membership.
- Identification of finite and sustainable sources of funding that aligns to the principles of the trust.
- Establish and sustain the governance systems of the trust.
- Build the capacity of the trust members to design and implement sustainable projects.

Clean Waters To the Sea has been working with Mangonui Haulage and Mangonui School to come up with some solutions as to how to manage waste. Denis Sparksman, owner and CEO of Haulage is interested in making a difference to the local community and getting the young ones (some of which are his grandchildren) involved. "We are all learning about how to operate a business that involves trucks and waste and land and water so that it cares for and sustains a healthy environment." ## What else have we achieved?

- Clean Waters to the sea has facilitated and supplied plants to 13 different landowners within the catchment for the purpose of erosion prevention, soil protection and sustainable riparian planting.
- Clean Waters to the sea now represents the Doubtless Bay community on the Waiora Northland Water Programme.
- Clean Waters to the sea is now Charitable Trust registered with Companies Societies and Trusts NZ.
- Clean Waters to the sea –Tokarau Moana Charitable Trust now operates under a Board of Governors.
